ABSTRACT

Public space is a challenge for women, it is happen because they see public spaces more strange and frightening than men. One of the challenges is street harassment. Cat Call as a street harassment is a hard challenge for women. Feminism then sees Cat Call as a form of male dominance that enters through patriarchal values that have remained there for many years. Patriarchs then generate stereotypes that make women regarded as 'The Other' not only for men, but for women themselves. Cat Call can happen anywhere, including in the environment of Telkom University which is an education area. By using phenomenology method as qualitative research method and using interview as data collecting technique, researcher then got result of research that the informant got different form of Cat Call experiences. Their experience then makes them feel so traumatized to be in the public space of Telkom University especially at night. There was no courage for the victims to fight, to protect themselves from their traumatized, they decided to avoid Telkom University's public spaces which they considered uncomfortable to go through and stopped to go somewhere alone.
