**ABSTRACT** 

Almost every society in Indonesia does activities that involve the use of plastic. Basically

plastic has become an important part of everyday life, whose use is difficult to replace with

other materials. Based on Jambeck data (2015), Indonesia is ranked second in the world for

producing plastic waste into the sea after China. Russell Maier, an environmental observer

from Canada introduced a new method of creative plastic waste management called Ecobrick

that can produce a variety of useful items. Ecobrick is a plastic bottle that is filled solidly with

non-biological waste to make building blocks that can be reused. Unfortunately, Ecobrick's

innovations have not been well socialized because in reality the program is new and there are

still many obstacles in its implementation. The author uses data collection methods such as

literature studies from various books relating to designing, observing, interviewing, and

distributing questionnaires to elementary school children aged 7-10 years. From the method it

was concluded that there were still many elementary school children who had never learned to

recycle waste. Therefore the author designed a media in the form of an illustrated book about

Ecobrick as a plastic waste handler for elementary school children. The author hopes that the

existence of this book can provide complete information about Ecobrick as a solution to

handling plastic waste and the danger of disposing of plastic waste carelessly.
