

ABSTRACT

Indonesia's cancellation as host of the U-20 World Cup was widely highlighted by online media in Indonesia. Several online media in Indonesia are actively reporting on Indonesia's cancellation as host, including the media kompas.com, CNNIndonesia, CNBC, liputan6, detik.com, bola.net and many more. The aim of this research is to find out how detik.com and bola.net media frame the news regarding Indonesia's cancellation as host of the 2023 U-20 World Cup using Robert N. Entman's framing analysis model. This research uses qualitative research methods using the constructivism paradigm, namely seeing that reality is the result of a social construction. The data collection technique in this research is by documenting the selected media and news. Documentation is carried out with the aim of studying the data that has been documented and then obtaining brief notes related to the problem being studied, so that the data is valid and not according to estimates. The results of the research show that the news published by detik.com media focuses more on the background to why FIFA revoked Indonesia's right to host, namely the Israeli national team's refusal to take part in the World Cup. Indonesia is also considered to be a victim of politicization due to the revocation of hosting rights. Meanwhile, the news published by bola.net media focuses more on the disappointment and regret of several parties, such as the Indonesian U-20 national team players and officials over Indonesia's cancellation of hosting the 2023 U-20 World Cup.
