Namely, the level of reality, representation and ideology. There are subjects that are analyzed, namely six pieces scene from a short filmPlease Be Quiet. Short film Please Be Quiet can represent the power of cases of sexual harassment in the workplace through the level of reality in the form of scenes, expressions and dialogues. At the representation level it is shown through the camera code and background code. While the level of ideology found in short films Please Be Quiet is a patriarchal ideology, namely how a man is shown to have rights of position and power that are higher than women.
