ABSTRACT

The findings are applied in the creation of fictional films, drawing inspiration from similar works such as "Negeri Di Bawah Kabut" (2011), "Filosofi Kopi" (2015), and "Warisan" (2021). The findings indicate that a narrative approach in film direction is effective in conveying messages and achieving desired objectives. Therefore, the role of the director becomes crucial in film production, ensuring that all aspects of the film contribute to effective message delivery and the achievement of set goals.
