

ABSTRACT

The dissemination of photo or video-based content without consent on the internet is referred to as Non-Consensual Dissemination Intimate Images (NCII). This NCII behavior is classified as online gender-based violence, which is often women who are victims. Like the case that happened to Rebecca Klopper in May 2023, she was a victim of illegal video dissemination on the internet which eventually became a topic of news on online media portals. The purpose of this study is to see how Detik.com and Tribunnews.com media frame Rebecca Klopper who is a victim of Non-Consensual Dissemination Intimate Images (NCII) violence so that it gives the victim blaming effect on the victim. The research method used is the Zhongdang Pan & Kosicki framing analysis method. The results showed that the online media portals Detik.com and Tribunnews.com in their news had a tendency to carry out victim blaming behavior towards the victim in the case of the spread of Rebecca Klopper's pornographic video on the internet.
