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Jute cloth or also known as burlap cloth is a cloth that existed during the Dutch colonial era. Burlap cloth is made from plant fibers in the form of jute (jute) and rosella (java jute). Jute fiber can be found from the bark of the Corchorus olitorius plant. Jute fiber has rough and hard surface characteristics so it can be a strong foundation for the main weave because it has a stiff texture. Based on observations, the use of jute material in fashion has been widely used in the interior sector and also in the fashion industry. As time goes by, the use of jute cloth in Indonesia is not only limited to sacks for storing food but is also used as material for fashion products. There are several collections that have been exhibited at fashion shows, but when seen in an international context the use of jute cloth has also been used by designers. international. The potential of jute fabric using surface textile techniques can be an attractive alternative application design and can add functional value, aesthetic value and also economic value to the jute sack material.
