

ABSTRACT

This final project report examines the contribution of students in the design and implementation of commercial projects, with a case study of a commercial project at Budi Pradono Architects. The author observed the involvement of students in interior design projects for a mall in Samarinda and a restaurant in Bogor. The internship experience at Budi Pradono Architects provided a deep understanding of professional interior design practices within an architectural studio context. This research aims to explain the role and responsibilities of interior design students in the redesign of commercial buildings, identify the skills and knowledge required for students to contribute effectively, and analyze the design contributions of students in collaboration with relevant stakeholders. This report examines the commercial project design process at Budi Pradono Architects, including the design stages, student involvement in each stage, and student contributions in producing innovative and relevant designs. The results of this research are expected to provide deep insights into student involvement in commercial projects and make a positive contribution to the development of interior design science, particularly in the context of professional practice in architectural firms.
