PMIS (Project Management Information System)	A digital platform designed to collect, manage, and disseminate project-related information to support decision-making and performance tracking throughout the project lifecycle.
QFD (Quality Function Deployment)	A structured method used to transform stakeholder needs (WHATs) into prioritized technical responses (HOWs), ensuring user-driven system design.
Stakeholder Needs (WHATs)	Expectations or requirements gathered from project stakeholders, expressed as qualitative statements that the system must fulfill.
Technical Responses (HOWs)	Specific PMIS features or functions proposed to meet stakeholder needs, derived during the QFD translation process.
House of Quality (HoQ)	A QFD matrix that visually maps the relationship between stakeholder needs and technical responses using weighted scoring.
Low-Fidelity Prototype	A basic, visual draft of the PMIS interface used to test functionality, navigation, and user interaction before full development.
Independent Solar Power Generation Systems Project	A government-initiated infrastructure project in Indonesia aimed at expanding rural electrification through solar PV systems across 65 locations.
VoC (Voice of the Customer)	A methodology for capturing user requirements and preferences through qualitative input such as interviews and open-ended questionnaires.
